At 8:00 p.m. on March 29, 2008, the world will turn off its lights for just one hour – Earth Hour – to show that it is possible to take action on climate change. Last year, almost 2.3 million people in Sydney, Australia participated – including more than 2,100 businesses. The result was a 10 per cent reduction on the electrical grid, a savings of 25,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide - the equivalent of taking about 50,000 cars off the road for one hour.
